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


 Strategy gives us the 'why' – the overarching purpose and outcomes for our actions.

 Implementation Strategy comes in again at the 'how' phase – strategy as the means of implementing policy








## Mark Moore's Theory of Public Value


























### Links

### Three Theoretical Concepts

- Street Level Bureaucrats (Michael Lipsky)
  - Unresolved dilemmas are passed down
  - Decisions on implementation (ie policy) made at street level
- Public Value (Mark Moore)
  - Authorising Environment
  - Individuals are co-producers of the outcomes
  - What value does each player add?
- Risk of Delivery (Aaron Wildavsky)
  - Distortion of policy intent 10%+ loss at each stage






Picture ref. - Fisheries 2027 – A long term vision for sustainable fisheries. Defra, October 2007




